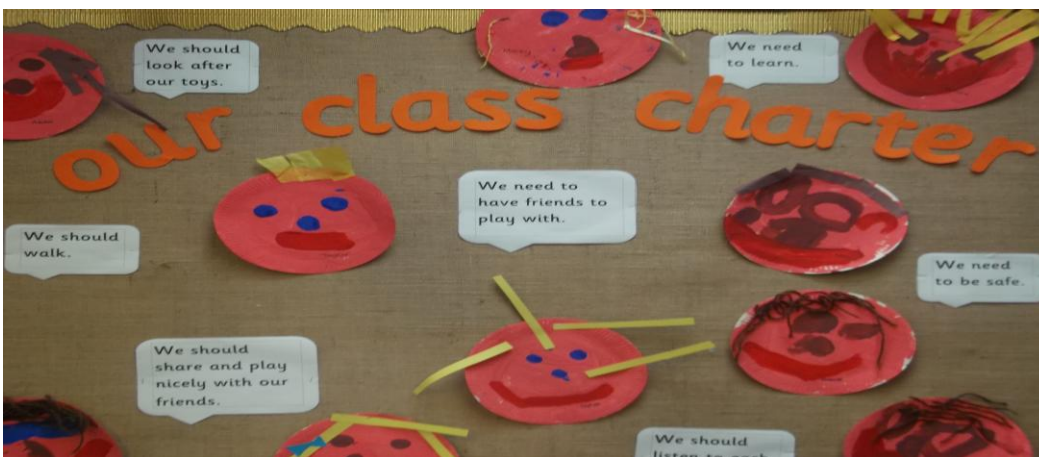
This means that we will be taught about children's rights and how to respect them.

Within classes children are being taught about the Rights Respecting Articles and are coming up with their own class charters.



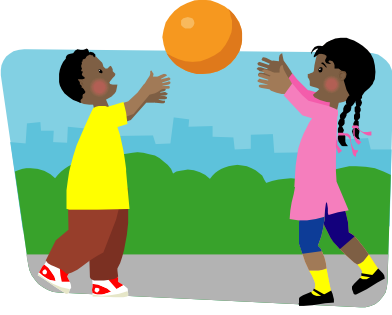
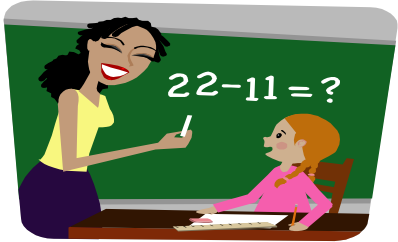
Reception Class Charte
