Early Years



The children in our Early Years classrooms have all settled in extremely well and have been a pleasure to teach!

Our new dedicated area, for our youngest children, is proving a great success. They are enjoying exploring their new environment and building strong relationships with their keyworkers.

Children in the Nursery and Reception class have been learning all about autumn. We have made autumn crafts, looked for signs of autumn outdoors and read autumn stories such as Rosie's Walk.

The Reception children have loved joining in with our Drawing Club sessions. They have been developing their fine motor skills and producing some fantastic drawings based on our text of the week. They are even starting to apply what they have learned in their phonics sessions to write their magic codes!

Key Stage One

What a start to the year! It has been so busy with children in Year 1 and 2 completing some fabulous work. It is always a challenge for pupils to move from Early Years into Year 1 but we are so proud of every child for being *ready*, *respectful* and *resilient* during this transition.

In English, the class have been studying the text *Old Bear* by Jane Hissey, they have been completing re-counts of the story gaining a thorough understanding of the characters and plot. The children have also created some lovely pictures demonstrating their understanding of the story's setting.

In maths, we have been concentrating on forming numbers correctly and have started to explore numbers up to 100. Children have also been comparing different amounts and learning some new 2D shapes. We encourage children to practice counting at home as much as possible.

In History, our focus has been the Great Fires of Gateshead and Newcastle and London. Children can recall lots of facts about this period of time. In Geography, we have focused on the location of the school and where they live. Children were very excited to spot their house on Google Maps!

Friday enrichment afternoons have been a blast. Children have enjoyed baking, time in forest school and even learning how to do some basic first aid.

Remember PE kits should be worn on our PE days which are Mondays and Tuesdays, as well as for Enrichment on Fridays. Earrings should not be worn in school please for safety reasons.

Reading books and any homework will be handed out on a Fridays to be returned by the next Wednesday. Please ensure you add a comment to your child's reading journal when you have read with them.

Key Stage Two



Year 6

Year 6 have had a great start to this academic year! The children have returned to school showing that they are READY to learn and READY for the year ahead. During Writing, they have enjoyed immersing themselves in the story of 'Rose Blanche' and after carrying out lots of work around this text, they each completed an excellent diary entry, stepping into the main character of the text. In addition, they have recently finished their first P.E unit; further developing their basketball skills. The children worked on their attacking and defending, as well as perfecting their shooting skills, before applying these skills to a competitive game. They certainly have some amazing basketball players within the class! Year 6 are glad to see Enrichment Fridays back and this half-term they have enjoyed working with New Writing North and football coaches: Dan and Henry.

Year 5

What a brilliant start to the year it's been for Year 5! The children have settled wonderfully into their new class routines and have shown fantastic focus and enthusiasm in all areas of their learning. In English, they have been exploring the theme of space through the inspiring book *"When We Walked on the Moon."* After completing their own exploration narratives, they are now hard at work writing Formal Mission Logs, using their imagination and growing confidence as writers to bring their work to life.

In Maths, the focus has been on Decimals. The children have enjoyed plenty of hands-on learning, using practical equipment and group activities to strengthen their understanding. Their teamwork and problem-solving skills have really shone through!

PE has been a real highlight this half term. Year 5 have completed a fantastic basketball unit, developing their passing, dribbling, shooting, and defending skills. They are now switching sports and taking on the challenge of badminton, learning new techniques and showing excellent coordination and sportsmanship.

It's been a busy and exciting few weeks in Year 5 — full of hard work, creativity and fun. We're incredibly proud of the effort and enthusiasm every child has shown so far!

Year 4

The children have made an excellent start to the year. They have loved the book we have focused on in English '*The Whale*' which has seen them write an amazing setting narrative and now newspaper reports about the sighting of a sea creature in our local area.

In Maths they have been practicing their addition and subtraction skills using the column method which they have become very efficient in.

The class have found the start of our Geography topic (Where are earthquakes and volcanoes most likely to happen?) and History (Children during World War 2) extremely interesting. They have taken part in lessons with enthusiasm, asked many questions and are eager to learn more.

In PE they have enjoyed building their skills in basketball and as part of World Mental Health Day thought of strategies to help their own mental health.

It's been a fantastic start to the year... keep up the great work year 4!

Year 3

We have really enjoyed returning to school for this Autumn term. The children have been amazing by already showing that they are not only ready to learn but they have shown respect with excellent manners and a determination to keep on trying and not give up.

In English we have been exploring the fantastic book *The Iron Man*. They wrote their own stories about the Iron Man approaching and how the characters felt about this. Now they are moving on to designing and giving instructions on how to trap The Iron Man.

In Maths we have been learning about numbers beyond 100. We have used dienes, place value charts and learnt different ways to add and subtract numbers to 100.

The children have a great enthusiasm for art, looking at prehistoric art, making their own animal sketches and experimenting with natural objects such as leaves, grass twigs and berries to make different colours.

Our focus in PE has been on basic skills. We have been reviewing techniques of balancing, jumping, running and ball skills. This will enable us to move on to other skills through the year.

Well done Year 3 for a great start.



INSET and Occasional Days

School will be closed to pupils on Monday 1st December and Friday 13th February.

After the 2 week Christmas holiday, children will return on Monday 5th January 2026.

Please avoid taking holidays in term time. **Holidays will not be authorised and may incur a penalty notice of £160 per parent per child from the Local Authority.** Please note from autumn term 2024, only 2 Penalty Notices can be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within a 3 year rolling period and any second notice within that period is charged at a higher rate. A third Penalty Notice cannot be issued therefore alternative action will be taken instead such as prosecution.

PE Days

PE days remain the same after half term:

Year 1 and 2	Mondays and Tuesdays
Year 3	Tuesday and Wednesday
Year 4	Swimming on Mondays, PE on Thursdays
Year 5	Tuesdays and Thursdays
Year 6	Mondays and Wednesdays

All children should also wear PE kit on Fridays for Enrichment activities. Please remember to write their name in PE hoodies to help us return lost property.

Attendance and punctuality

We would like to congratulate the amazing children who have 100% attendance this school year. We also have lots of other children whose attendance is above our target of 97% and many others who have improved their attendance considerably this term.

All children need to arrive at school on time. Missing the first part of the school day means they are not ready for the day ahead. Please can all parents and carers support us in ensuring your child arrives on time.

School attendance is essential. If your child has attendance less than 90%, they are classed as **persistent absentees** and their attendance in school is a cause for concern. You will receive a letter if your child is persistently absent or late for school advising you of steps that will be put in place if improvements are not made.

A REMINDER holidays taken during term time are not permitted, will be unauthorised and you may receive a penalty notice of £160 per child per parent.

School Uniform and Coats

Thank you to all the children who are wearing their correct school uniform and bringing a coat to school every day.

As a reminder, all children should be wearing the correct uniform at all times:

Uniform days

- White polo shirt

- Royal Blue sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan
- Grey trousers or skirt
- Sensible black flat school shoes or trainers

PE days (see above for which days your child has PE)

- White t shirt
- Royal blue shorts or black leggings/jogging bottoms
- Royal blue hoodie
- Trainers

Jumpers, cardigans and hoodies do not need to have the school logo but can be purchased from [Logos Unlimited](#) who also have a store at Team Valley.

Coats

As the weather has started to turn colder, we also expect that all children have warm coat with them every day to ensure that they can play and learn outdoors. As the weather gets colder, children should also bring a hat and gloves.

Please ensure that all items of clothing including coats and shoes have names written inside on the labels. Children's clothing is getting mixed up every day as there are lots of similar coats and shoes.

If you have an issue providing your child with the correct uniform, please discuss this with their class teacher.

Our Year 5/6 Girls' Football Team also took to the pitch for a tournament at Goals in Gateshead — on a very wet afternoon! The girls played superbly, conceding only one goal all day and finishing third in their group — a fantastic achievement!
