Experience teaching in KS1 or primary settings (including placements). Experience managing classroom behaviour effectively. Experience working with pupils with SEND and adapting provision accordingly.	Experience supporting reading fluency and intervention. Familiarity with school assessment systems (e.g., Arbor).
